The Director shall provide a 14 day public comment period prior to making a threshold determination of non significance (DNS) or publishing a decision on the project; provided that the comment period shall be extended by 14 days if a written request for extension is submitted within the initial 14 day comment period; provided further that the comment period shall be 30 days for applications requiring shoreline decisions except that for limited utility extensions and bulkheads subject to Section 23.60.065, the comment period shall be 20 days as specified in Section 23.60.065. The comment period shall begin on the date notice is published in the Land Use Information Bulletin. Comments shall be filed with the Director by 5 p.m. of the last day of the comment period. If the last day of the comment period is a Saturday, Sunday, or federal or City holiday, the comment period shall run until 5 p.m. the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or federal or City holiday. Any comments received after the end of the official comment period may be considered if the comment is material to review yet to be conducted.
