Subject: Traffic concern - 29th Ave E and E Madison St.

To Whom It May Concern:

I live on East Madison Street and 29th Avenue East. I am concerned about the safety issue of increased traffic likely to result from the new project soon to be built on the City People's site: 2938 E Madison St. With apartments and a PCC store to be built almost directly across from where I live, I believe that with the increased traffic it is going to become even more difficult and dangerous than it already is to exit from my driveway by car onto East Madison Street and even more difficult and dangerous to walk across the street at 29th Avenue East and East Madison (where there is currently only a crosswalk but no traffic light). I cross at this juncture often and often have to wait a long time to cross the street because traffic does not always stop for pedestrians at the crosswalk. Often drivers going one way might stop while drivers going the other way will not stop for pedestrians trying to cross the street. This is a very dangerous situation and I fear that this intersection will become even more dangerous for pedestrians and drivers once the new building brings increased traffic to the area from so many new shoppers and residents.

I would like to propose that a traffic light be installed on 29th Ave E and East Madison Street in anticipation of even heavier traffic flow along East Madison once the new building is built. This would make it not only easier but certainly a lot safer for drivers and pedestrians, especially those of us who happen to also be residents of this exact neighborhood. Thank you very much for your consideration of this important safety issue.
