I'm forwarding the most recent e-mail from SDOT regarding dual access for the project at 2925 E Madison Street. As noted in the e-mail, SDOT supports the dual access proposal for both safety and traffic operations reasons. As E Madison St is a pedestrian street, the Land Use Code (SMC 23.47A.032 A2) would require access to occur only from Dewey Pl E. Based on my review of the transportation information submitted for this project, I agree that dual access likely will best serve both this project and the surrounding area.

This analysis confirms SDOT's previous support for dual access (residential access off Dewey and commercial access off Madison) given both greater safety concerns for people walking and biking on Madison and additional delay/reduced LOS associated with the single access scenario. SDOT does not recommend installing a turn pocket at the driveway at this time.
