ORDER ON APPELLANT MCC'S MOTION TO CONTINUE HEARING

1. Motion. Magnolia Community Council and Others requested a 60-day hearing continuance. Applicant Oceanstar, LLC opposed continuance. The other parties did not take a position.

2. Background. MCC appealed a Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections decision for two residences on May 6. The case was consolidated with the Friends of the Last 6,000 appeal filed the same day. A prehearing conference was held on May 18. With party consensus, five days were reserved for hearing (August 19, 23, and 25, and September 7 and 8).¹ As the Prehearing Order provided, on June 3, Oceanstar moved to dismiss. While the motion was pending, MCC requested document subpoenas. As the dismissal motion had the potential to narrow discovery scope, the Examiner stayed the subpoena request until the motion was ruled on.² On June 28, the appeal was narrowed.³

MCC renewed its subpoena requests. The Applicant moved to quash, and the Examiner entered a July 19 order finding the subpoenas went beyond appeal scope but could be revised.⁴ The parties agreed on scope, and the Office issued the subpoenas on August 10, with an agreed-on August 16 deadline.

The Hearing Examiner may continue a hearing "for good cause."⁵ Had the SEPA issues not been stricken for lack of jurisdiction, the standard procedure is for the appeal to be decided within 90-days of appeal filing, or August 6. Absent party agreement, only a single

30-day extension is allowed.⁶ With this standard, MCC's continuance request delaying the hearing until October or later could not be accommodated:

30 days following document production to review documents, schedule and take depositions and ... to allow 30 days after completion of the last deposition to receive and review transcripts and prepare for hearing.⁷

With the SEPA dismissal and Council waiver during the pandemic, this code provision does not apply, but the Examiner is cognizant of the code's efficiency directive. The MCC appeal is not factually or legally complex, with view and stair use impacts from the two residences being the core concerns. Once the Order on the Motion to Dismiss was issued June 28, though discovery scope was disputed, the issues before the Examiner were clear. There is good cause for only modest scheduling adjustments.

To allow MCC additional preparation time the August 19 hearing date will be stricken, and Friends of the Last 6000 appeal may proceed first, going forward on August 23, with August 25 reserved if a second hearing day on this appeal is needed. The MCC appeal could then commence on September 7, with September 8 reserved. Staggering the two appeals allows MCC added preparation time while keeping delay to a minimum.

With the narrowed issues (on both appeals), four hearing days should be sufficient. Given the number of witnesses MCC has listed, the parties are directed to keep witness testimony on only the issues before the Examiner and avoid repetitive testimony. The added preparation time will assist with maintaining a tighter focus. As a precaution, the parties should coordinate with the Examiner's Office to reserve an extra day in September.

ORDER

MCC's motion for continuance is **DENIED** in part and **GRANTED** in part. The August 19 hearing date is stricken. August 23 and 25 are reserved for the Friends of the Last 6000 appeal. The MCC appeal will proceed on September 7 and 8. The parties are directed to coordinate with the clerk to schedule one additional reserve hearing day in September.
