- 3. TreePAC strongly believes that Seattle needs an updated tree protection ordinance. TreePAC's top priority goal has been to work with the Mayor and Seattle City Council to enact a stronger ordinance. Rapidly changing Seattle is losing critical tree canopy volume. Meanwhile, preservation and planting of new trees is a critical component of addressing climate change resiliency and mitigation.
- 4. TreePAC has been very involved in the Tree Protection Ordinance Update process, which is the subject of the SEPA threshold determination that was appealed in this matter. TreePAC worked last year with the Northwest Progressive Institute to develop and conduct two polls done by Change Research, a national polling firm, to assess community support in Seattle for various provisions that the Seattle City Council had proposed in Council Resolution 31902 and that the Seattle Urban Forestry Commission had proposed in its draft Tree and Urban Forest Protection Ordinance. TreePAC has engaged in an extensive grassroots effort to alert the public about the current Tree Protection Ordinance Update, to inform the public about the issues presented, and to inform the public about the opportunities to comment on the Update.
- 5. TreePAC is spearheading several campaigns with the goal of preserving Seattle's Tree Canopy through the Tree Protection Ordinance Update. Our Yardsign Campaign goal is to distribute yard signs throughout the city that say: "Save Our Trees" and "Trees Create Healthy Communities" to raise awareness of and stimulate public involvement in the Tree Protection Ordinance Update process. TreePACs letter writing campaign urges people to write to the City Council about issues that are important to them with the Update. TreePAC has an active website and member newsletter. TreePAC also has a presence on social media facebook and twitter accounts. TreePAC continues to work with and help co-ordinate coalition efforts by neighborhood, environmental, civic, political and other groups and organizations to provide input into the process of passing an updated Tree Protection Ordinance.
