15 provide testimony regarding Alki Elementary including daily operations, staffing, and
16 community demographics. The District anticipates Mr. Skeffington’s testimony will require

19 Clingan may provide testimony regarding Alki Elementary, including student family experiences
20 and traffic and pedestrian circulation. The District anticipates Ms. Clingan’s testimony will

2 and a parent at Alki Elementary and may provide testimony regarding student family experiences
