- 3. <u>Ed Lazowska</u> is the Bill & Melinda Gates Chair in the Paul G. Allen School of Computer Science & Engineering at the University of Washington and a Senior Data Science Fellow in the University's eScience Institute. Dr. Lazowska has a Doctorate degree in Computer Science from the University of Toronto. Dr. Lazowska is expected about testify about the need to increase enrollment capacity at the University, particularly in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics programs; the University's current space deficit; and about the public benefits of the University's innovation and research partnerships. Dr. Lazowska's direct testimony will require approximately 30 minutes.
- 4. Thaisa Way is Chair of the University of Washington Faculty Senate, a professor in the University's College of Built Environments, and the Executive Director of Urban@UW. Dr. Way has a Doctorate degree in the History of Architecture and Urbanism from Cornell University and a Master of Architectural History degree from the University of Virginia. Dr. Way is expected to testify about the future needs of the University's innovation and academic research partnerships. Dr. Way's direct testimony will require approximately 45 minutes.
- 5. <u>Julie Blakeslee</u> is an Environmental and Land Use Planner with the University of Washington. Ms. Blakeslee has over 20 years' experience managing, preparing and reviewing environmental impact statements. Ms. Blakeslee is expected to testify about the University's environmental review process and elements of the Plan. Ms. Blakeslee's direct testimony will require approximately 1 hour.
- 6. Rich Schipanski is a Manager of Planning and Environmental Review at EA Engineering, Science, and Technology, the firm hired to prepare the environmental impact statement ("EIS"). Mr. Schipanski has a Master in City Planning degree from San Diego State University and over 29 years' experience in the fields of land use assessment and environmental impact analysis. Mr. Schipanski's testimony is expected to provide a general overview of the analysis and conclusions in the EIS and discussion of alternatives. He is also expected to testify to

the EIS analysis of the Plan's compliance with height rezone criteria and the EIS analysis of utilities impacts. Mr. Schipanski's direct testimony will require approximately 1 hour.

- 7. Rebecca Barnes is the University Architect and Associate Vice Provost.

 Ms. Barnes has a Master of Architecture degree from the University of Oregon and has completed the Loeb Fellowship in Advanced Environmental Design. She is expected to testify about the Plan's guiding planning principles, the University's internal design and development process, and the Plan's sector-based guidelines and standards. Ms. Barnes' direct testimony will require approximately 2 hours.
- 8. Theresa Doherty is the Senior Project Director for the Campus Master Plan.

 Ms. Doherty holds a Master of Public Administration degree from the University of Washington and has over 25 years' experience working in the University's administration. She is expected to testify about the Plan's contents, open space commitments, changes between the draft Plan and the final Plan, and the University's position on certain recommendations by the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections ("SDCI"). Ms. Doherty's testimony may also include a discussion of the Plan's guiding planning principles, the University's internal design and development process, and the Plan's sector-based guidelines and standards. In addition,

 Ms. Doherty's testimony may touch on the history of development under prior campus master plans. Ms. Doherty's direct testimony will require approximately 1 hour.
- 9. Sally Clark is the Director of the Office of Regional and Community Relations at the University of Washington. Ms. Clark holds a Master in Public Administration degree from the University of Washington. Ms. Clark is expected to testify about CUCAC meetings based on her role as an ex officio member, the University's voluntary efforts to increase access to affordable housing and childcare, the U-PASS program, and the University's position on certain recommendations by SDCI. Ms. Clark's direct testimony will require approximately 1 hour.
- 10. <u>Michael Swenson</u> is a principal with TranspoGroup, which the University retained as transportation consultant in connection with the preparation of the EIS and Plan. Mr. Swenson

is a licensed professional engineer with more than 20 years' experience in transportation and traffic engineering operations. Mr. Swenson is expected to provide expert opinion testimony that the Plan will not have significant adverse environmental impacts on transportation. His testimony is also expected to include a discussion of the data and analysis contained in the EIS and appendices that led to TranspoGroup's conclusion. Mr. Swenson may also offer expert opinion testimony regarding SDCI's recommended transportation mitigation measures. Mr. Swenson's direct testimony will require approximately 45 minutes.

- 11. **Jeanne Acutanza** is the President of AcutanzaSTS and the former Director of Public Agency Services with TranspoGroup. Ms. Acutanza is a licensed professional engineer with more than 30 years' experience as a transportation planner and traffic engineer. Her testimony is expected to include a discussion of the data and analysis that led to TranspoGroup's conclusions, transportation and data and analysis in the Plan, and SDCI's recommended transportation mitigation measures. Ms. Acutazna's direct testimony will require approximately 45 minutes.
- as its housing consultant in connection with the preparation of the EIS and Plan. Mr. Shook has a Master of Urban and Regional Planning degree from Portland State University and more than 10 years' experience as a consultant in data analysis and modeling.
