14 The University of Washington submits the following list of witnesses and exhibits.

15 **I. WITNESSES**

16 The University expects to call the following witnesses for the purposes described below:

17 1. **Caitlyn Clauson** is a principal and a higher education planner with Sasaki  
18 Associates, the architectural firm retained to prepare the 2018 Campus Master Plan. Ms. Clauson  
19 has a Master of Urban Planning degree from the University of Michigan and has worked on more  
20 than a dozen master plans for various public and private colleges and universities. Ms. Clauson is  
21 expected to provide the initial overview of the Campus Master Plan. Ms. Clauson's direct  
22 testimony will require approximately 1 hour 30 minutes.

23 2. **Ana Mari Cauce** is the 33rd President of the University of Washington.  
24 President Cauce is expected to testify about the University's role and missions as a public  
25 institution of higher education; the University's commitment to diversity and access to higher  
26 education; and its vision for the Seattle campus over the next decade and the longer term.

1 President Cauce's direct testimony will require approximately 30 minutes.

2 3. **Ed Lazowska** is the Bill & Melinda Gates Chair in the Paul G. Allen School of  
3 Computer Science & Engineering at the University of Washington and a Senior Data Science  
4 Fellow in the University's eScience Institute. Dr. Lazowska has a Doctorate degree in Computer  
5 Science from the University of Toronto. Dr. Lazowska is expected about testify about the need to  
6 increase enrollment capacity at the University, particularly in the areas of science, technology,  
7 engineering, and mathematics programs; the University's current space deficit; and about the  
8 public benefits of the University's innovation and research partnerships. Dr. Lazowska's direct  
9 testimony will require approximately 30 minutes.

10 4. **Thaisa Way** is Chair of the University of Washington Faculty Senate, a professor  
11 in the University's College of Built Environments, and the Executive Director of Urban@UW.  
12 Dr. Way has a Doctorate degree in the History of Architecture and Urbanism from Cornell  
13 University and a Master of Architectural History degree from the University of Virginia. Dr. Way  
14 is expected to testify about the future needs of the University's innovation and academic research  
15 partnerships. Dr. Way's direct testimony will require approximately 45 minutes.

16 5. **Julie Blakeslee** is an Environmental and Land Use Planner with the University of  
17 Washington. Ms. Blakeslee has over 20 years' experience managing, preparing and reviewing  
18 environmental impact statements. Ms. Blakeslee is expected to testify about the University's  
19 environmental review process and elements of the Plan. Ms. Blakeslee's direct testimony will  
20 require approximately 1 hour.

21 6. **Rich Schipanski** is a Manager of Planning and Environmental Review at EA  
22 Engineering, Science, and Technology, the firm hired to prepare the environmental impact  
23 statement ("EIS"). Mr. Schipanski has a Master in City Planning degree from San Diego State  
24 University and over 29 years' experience in the fields of land use assessment and environmental  
25 impact analysis. Mr. Schipanski's testimony is expected to provide a general overview of the  
26 analysis and conclusions in the EIS and discussion of alternatives. He is also expected to testify to

1 the EIS analysis of the Plan's compliance with height rezone criteria and the EIS analysis of  
2 utilities impacts. Mr. Schipanski's direct testimony will require approximately 1 hour.

3 7. **Rebecca Barnes** is the University Architect and Associate Vice Provost.  
4 Ms. Barnes has a Master of Architecture degree from the University of Oregon and has completed  
5 the Loeb Fellowship in Advanced Environmental Design. She is expected to testify about the  
6 Plan's guiding planning principles, the University's internal design and development process, and  
7 the Plan's sector-based guidelines and standards. Ms. Barnes' direct testimony will require  
8 approximately 2 hours.

9 8. **Theresa Doherty** is the Senior Project Director for the Campus Master Plan.  
10 Ms. Doherty holds a Master of Public Administration degree from the University of Washington  
11 and has over 25 years' experience working in the University's administration. She is expected to  
12 testify about the Plan's contents, open space commitments, changes between the draft Plan and  
13 the final Plan, and the University's position on certain recommendations by the Seattle  
14 Department of Construction and Inspections ("SDCI"). Ms. Doherty's testimony may also include  
15 a discussion of the Plan's guiding planning principles, the University's internal design and  
16 development process, and the Plan's sector-based guidelines and standards. In addition,  
17 Ms. Doherty's testimony may touch on the history of development under prior campus master  
18 plans. Ms. Doherty's direct testimony will require approximately 1 hour.

19 9. **Sally Clark** is the Director of the Office of Regional and Community Relations at  
20 the University of Washington. Ms. Clark holds a Master in Public Administration degree from the  
21 University of Washington. Ms. Clark is expected to testify about CUCAC meetings based on her  
22 role as an ex officio member, the University's voluntary efforts to increase access to affordable  
23 housing and childcare, the U-PASS program, and the University's position on certain  
24 recommendations by SDCI. Ms. Clark's direct testimony will require approximately 1 hour.

25 10. **Michael Swenson** is a principal with TranspoGroup, which the University retained  
26 as transportation consultant in connection with the preparation of the EIS and Plan. Mr. Swenson

1 is a licensed professional engineer with more than 20 years' experience in transportation and  
2 traffic engineering operations. Mr. Swenson is expected to provide expert opinion testimony that  
3 the Plan will not have significant adverse environmental impacts on transportation. His testimony  
4 is also expected to include a discussion of the data and analysis contained in the EIS and  
5 appendices that led to TranspoGroup's conclusion. Mr. Swenson may also offer expert opinion  
6 testimony regarding SDCI's recommended transportation mitigation measures. Mr. Swenson's  
7 direct testimony will require approximately 45 minutes.

8 11. **Jeanne Acutanza** is the President of AcutanzaSTS and the former Director of  
9 Public Agency Services with TranspoGroup. Ms. Acutanza is a licensed professional engineer  
10 with more than 30 years' experience as a transportation planner and traffic engineer. Her  
11 testimony is expected to include a discussion of the data and analysis that led to TranspoGroup's  
12 conclusions, transportation and data and analysis in the Plan, and SDCI's recommended  
13 transportation mitigation measures. Ms. Acutazna's direct testimony will require approximately  
14 45 minutes.

15 12. **Morgan Shook** is a Director with ECONorthwest, which the University retained  
16 as its housing consultant in connection with the preparation of the EIS and Plan. Mr. Shook has a  
17 Master of Urban and Regional Planning degree from Portland State University and more than 10  
18 years' experience as a consultant in data analysis and modeling. Mr. Shook is expected to provide  
19 expert opinion testimony that the Plan will not have a significant adverse environmental impact  
20 on housing. His testimony is also expected to include a discussion of the data and analysis that led  
21 to his conclusion. Mr. Shook may also offer expert opinion testimony regarding SDCI's  
22 recommended affordable housing mitigation measure. Mr. Shook's direct testimony will require  
23 approximately 45 minutes.
