98 Union Home Owners Association Appeal of Viaduct Demolition Noise Ordinance Variance MUP #3029782

1. WHAT IS YOUR INTEREST IN THE DECISION? (STATE HOW YOU ARE AFFECTED BY IT.)

a. 98 Union Home Owners Association is an association of 75 residential condo owners who are located at the intersection of First Ave & Union Street. Our proximity to the Alaskan Way Viaduct and the two ramps (at Seneca & Columbia Streets) will mean that work will be occurring in our vicinity for an extended period. We believe that the variance to the noise ordinance allowing late night work, left unmodified, will result in our owners' inability to sleep.

2. WHAT ARE YOUR OBJECTIONS TO THE DECISION? (LIST AND DESCRIBE WHAT YOU BELIEVE TO BE THE ERRORS, OMISSIONS, OR OTHER PROBLEMS WITH THIS DECISION.)

a. When granting the variance, the Director failed to adequately consider that the ambient noise drops to zero normally during the early morning hours and thus the introduction of frequent spikes throughout the night of construction trucks, generators, equipment staging, debris moving, etc. relative to the background noise will be much greater and more apparent than during the time of day than when the background noise is routinely high (traffic, sirens, various construction projects, home appliances, etc.). The failure of the Director to consider this will result in months of thousands of people unable to sleep in hotel rooms, apartments, and condos that populate the vicinity of the Viaduct & Seneca/Columbia ramps.

3. WHAT RELIEF DO YOU WANT? (SPECIFY WHAT YOU WANT THE EXAMINER TO DO: REVERSE THE DECISION, MODIFY CONDITIONS, ETC.)

- a. No "impact work" to occur between the hours of 2200 and 0700.
- b. The demolition of the two ramps to occur simultaneously to minimize the duration of the noise in the community.
- c. Prohibit occurrence of work between the hours of 2200 and 0700 that is louder than inspections, worker assembly, safety briefings, briefings, utility locating, etc.
- d. Establish a City of Seattle "Hotline" (phone, email, & online form) to which people can report noise ordinance violations.
- e. Dedicate a City of Seattle ombudsperson to be available each night between the hours of 2200 and 0700 to investigate complaints in real time.
- f. Provide for fines for violations that are increasingly punitive for the contractor(s) found violating the noise ordinance.
- g. Provide quarterly updates to residents by post cards and reiterate the HOTLINE and the number of violations and sum of fines during the prior month and project to date. The quarterly update would also present the updated schedule and identify the areas in the path of impact in the coming quarter.
- h. Post weekly updates on a website reporting the progress, the seven day look forward construction work.
