INTRODUCTION 18 Pursuant to the Second Prehearing Order, Appellant Beacon Hill Council of Seattle (BHCS) 19 submits its Preliminary Witness and Exhibit List. These lists are indeed preliminary. As of the 20 preparation date of this Preliminary Witness and Exhibit List, the Respondent provided (on March 21 22, 2018 and March 28, 2018) tens of thousands of pages of documents in zip files, some of which 22 are germane to Appellants' discovery requests, but Appellant's Authorized Representative has not 23 had adequate time to fully review them. The Respondent has not answered the interrogatory

requests from other Appellants in this appeal. Accordingly, the Appellant does not know whether any of the exhibits listed below will actually be necessary at the hearing. Additionally, since the Respondent has not answered the Appellants' interrogatories, it is impossible to know whether there will be additional witnesses or exhibits for the hearing, including, but not limited to, City of Seattle employees and contractors, and City of Seattle documents and contractors' documents. And, after receipt of responses to written interrogatories and all the documents requested, the Appellant may schedule depositions based on the information received. Accordingly, given the truncated time to hearing, the Appellant's witnesses and exhibit list may not be available until the cut-off date for the final witness list and final exhibit list. If information from the Respondent becomes promptly available and if the information provided can be quickly digested (as opposed to tens of thousands of documents at one time), then Appellant will supplement this Preliminary Witness and Document list as such information becomes available. Additionally, the Appellant reserves the right (a) to call any witness identified by any party, (b) to use any of the documents identified by any other party, (c) to call substitute witnesses if any identified witness becomes unavailable, (d) to call rebuttal witnesses, (e) to call additional witnesses as allowed by Seattle Hearing Examiner Rules, and. (f) to supplement this preliminary witness and document list as new or more information becomes available.

II. WITNESS LIST

Appellant may call the following witnesses to testify at the appeal hearing. The general subject matter of their expected testimony is noted below.

- 1. Dr. Timothy (Tim) Larson (tlarson@uw.edu, 206-543-6815, UW Campus Wilcox Bldg 269). Dr. Larson is a professor in the Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering and the Department of Environmental & Occupational Health Sciences, where he teaches courses on air pollution control and air quality modeling. He is also the co-director of the Master of Science in Civil Engineering: Energy Infrastructure. Larson has over 35 years of experience in air quality research, specifically in characterization of urban air pollution and its sources. His major focus in recent years has been on assessment of human exposure to outdoor air pollutants, and he has collaborated with other UW researchers on many projects related to the health consequences of exposure to air pollution. Dr. Larson's education includes a Bachelor of Science in Chemical Engineering, Lehigh University, 1968; a Master of Science in Chemical Engineering., University of Washington, 1972; and a Ph.D. in civil engineering from the University of Washington, 1976. He is Co-Principal Investigator for Mobile Observations of Ultrafine Particles (MOV-UP) Study. http://deohs.washington.edu/mov-up. Dr. Larson is expected to testify, regarding air pollution issues in North Beacon Hill and the inadequacy of the City's analysis in the FEIS. (2.5 hours)
- 2. Dr. Troy D. Abel (<u>Troy.Abel@wwu.edu</u>, 360-739-65960. Dr. Abel's research and teaching interests focus on the dynamic tensions of environmental science and democratic politics in the fields of environmental justice, information disclosure and climate governance. He is an Associate Professor of Environmental Policy at Western Washington University's Huxley College of the Environment, a co-recipient of the Lynton Keith Caldwell award for the MIT

Press publication Coming Clean: Information Disclosure and Environmental Performance, and more recently, Dr. Abel published a series of articles in the American Journal of Public Health, Interdisciplinary Environmental Review, and Sustainability on the intersections between environmental injustice, gentrification and sustainability in Seattle, WA. He is currently the principal investigator on a Climate Risk Governance study funded by the National Science Foundation and a co-lead on a Collaborative Problem Solving and Environmental Justice project funded by the EPA. Dr. Abel has directed or co-directed extramurally funded research projects that total more than 1.6 million dollars and is a recognized North American expert on environmental information disclosure and environmental justice, the American Editor of the International Journal of Environment and Pollution, and has served as an expert panelist for the US Environmental Protection Agency's Science Advisory Board. Recent publication "Risky Business: Sustainability and Industrial Land Use Across Seattle's Gentrifying Riskscape", Sustainability, Vol 7, Issue 11. Dr. Abel is expected to testify, regarding air and noise pollution issues in North Beacon Hill and the inadequacy of the City's analysis in the FEIS. (2.5 hours)
